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based instructional model in which learners engage with an authentic ill structured problem that requires further research jonassen hung 2008 the problem based learning institute pbli pbli org has developed curricular materials i e problems and teacher training programs in pbl for all core disciplines in high school barrows kelson 1993 in brief pbl is a pedagogical approach that enables students to learn while engaging actively with meaningful problems problem based learning pbl challenges students to identify and examine real problems then work together to address and solve those problems through advocacy and by mobilizing resources problem based learning pbl is an instructional method aimed at preparing students for real world settings by requiring students to solve problems pbl enhances students learning outcomes by promoting their abilities and skills in applying knowledge solving problems practicing higher order thinking and self directing their own learning problem based learning is a method of teaching where students are presented with a real or realistic problem such as a case study or hypothetical situation and use inductive reasoning to learn both information about the topic and how to think critically about it this kind of learning is a student focused approach to teaching in which instruction is done by having students focus on problems while working in groups this approach serves two purposes first this approach helps students to construct knowledge rather than passively learn it which helps to promote retention of information problem based learning pbl is an instructional method of hands on active learning centered on the investigation and resolution of messy real world problems problem based learning is a teaching method in which students learn through the complex and open ended problems these problems are real world problems and are used to encourage students learning through principles and concept pbl is both a teaching
