the stories of yasunari kawabata evoke an unmistakably japanese atmosphere in their delicacy understatement and lyrical description like his later works first snow on fuji is concerned with forms of presence and absence with being with memory and loss of memory with not knowing kawabata lets us slide into the lives of people who have been shattered by war loss and longing these stories are beautiful and melancholy filled with kawabata s unerring vision of human psychology first snow on fuji was originally published in japan in 1958 ten years before kawabata received the nobel prize kawabata selected the stories for this collection himself and the result is a stunning assembly of disparate moods and genres this new edition is the first to be published in english

premio nobel de literatura traducidos por primera vez al castellano los relatos de primera nieve en el monte fuji fueron seleccionados por el propio kawabata y publicados en 1958 dos de ellos yumira y el cristantemo en la roca fueron incluidos posteriormente en una antología de sus cuentos favoritos que se publicó poco después de que recibiera el premio nobel de literatura en 1968 los relatos que presentamos son a la vez una ventana al muy específico mundo doméstico de la posguerra japonesa y una reflexión destilada al máximo sobre los sentimientos y las contradicciones humanas sobre el ser y la memoria sobre las incógnitas de la belleza y del silencio esta antología es una fina muestra de la grandeza de kawabata en los pequeños mundos de trazos delicados que se abren con cada cuento en medio de sus resonancias y su luminosidad descubrimos siempre la inteligencia inquisitiva y el humor de uno de los grandes del siglo xx

sinister resonance begins with the premise that sound is a haunting a ghost a presence whose location is ambiguous and whose existence is transitory the intangibility of sound is uncanny a phenomenal presence in the head at its point of source and all around the close listener is like a medium who draws out substance from that which is not entirely there the history of listening must be constructed from the narratives of myth and fiction silent arts such as painting the resonance of architecture auditory artefacts and nature in such contexts sound often functions as a metaphor for

mystical revelation forbidden desires formlessness the unknown and the unconscious as if reading a map of hitherto unexplored territory sinister resonance deciphers sounds and silences buried within the ghostly horrors of arthur machen shirley jackson charles dickens m r james and edgar allen poe dutch genre painting from rembrandt to vermeer artists as diverse as francis bacon and juan munoz and the writing of many modernist authors including virginia woolf samuel beckett and james joyce

interaction between traditional and modern forces and the encroachment of western ideas and writing the second half conveys the changes that have transformed japan since the end of the pacific war such as the heady transition from poverty to prosperity the friction between conflicting ideologies and political beliefs and the growing influence of popular culture on the country s artistic and intellectual traditions featuring sensitive translations of works by nagai kafu natsume soseki oe kenzaburo kawabata yasunari mishima yukio and many others this anthology relates an essential portrait of japan s dynamic modernization
