the life course of serious and violent youth grown up addresses significant gaps in the literature on youth involved in chronic serious and violent offending through longitudinal research and a long follow up into adulthood it challenges common perceptions about offending outcomes using theoretically grounded methodologically sophisticated and empirically driven research this book culminates 20 years of data emerging from the incarcerated serious and violent young offender study isvyos initiated in 1998 to understand the origins of serious and violent youth offending it follows 1 719 formerly incarcerated youth through adulthood and offers a contemporary perspective to questions about chronic offending in adolescence and social and offending outcomes in adulthood the authors provide a theoretically framed examination of new findings from the isvyos regarding participants justice system involvement from onset to persistence to desistance most participants experienced continued involvement in the justice system in adulthood however contrary to past literature isvyos findings challenge static descriptions of chronic offending and notions of the youth super predator isvyos findings also challenge assertions that experiences and risk factors in childhood and adolescence are not informative of adult justice system involvement together the findings call for a more humanistic approach that recognizes that the complex lives of individuals formerly incarcerated in adolescence implies that desistance does not happen by default this book will be of great interest to scholars researchers and students of forensic psychology developmental and life course criminology youth justice and violent crime

people who never thought they had a chance to experience life as an adult outside prison by looking in depth at the lives of some of the individuals serving life terms and understanding both the prosecutors who oppose review and resentencing of juvenile lifers and those who are sincerely following the supreme court's guidelines this book provides a comprehensive understanding of the issues as well as the people involved in the sentencing and potential resentencing of juveniles to life without the possibility of parole the authors provide unique perceptive and straightforward profiles on some of the prisoners who were ultimately sentenced to lwp after being involved in criminal offenses committed before their 18th birthdays the book poignantly features the experiences of young people who did not commit a murder yet were still sentenced to life terms but also delves into the perspectives of the families of victims of juvenile offenders prosecutors on both sides of the issue psychologists who have interviewed many of the juvenile lifers and advocates for change in the way juveniles are treated by the criminal justice system the decisions in miller v alabama and montgomery v louisiana clearly demonstrated that the court's view of juveniles evolved over decades to reflect advances in our understanding of the unique characteristics of youth and their involvement in juvenile crimes this book takes the position that the sentence of life without the possibility of parole for youth is wasteful of both human lives and scarce public resources the authors write about the human concerns on both sides of the question and ultimately allow readers to make their own decisions about how society should best handle juvenile offenders this engaging ethnographic treatment will appeal to students and scholars of criminology corrections juvenile justice and delinquency practitioners working in social policy and all those interested in a criminal justice system capable of positive outcomes for involved youth

urbanization has had a major impact on livelihoods in ghana and throughout africa as a whole however much research on urbanization has focused on effects occurring within cities while there is insufficient understanding of its effects on rural areas this paper examines the impact of urbanization

through a typology of districts on rural livelihoods in Ghana the country's districts are classified into seven spatial groups according to the size of the largest city in each district in southern and northern Ghana the paper does not address rural urban migration but instead focuses on the livelihoods of rural households in contrast to the extensive literature focusing on the effects of urbanization on individuals we assess its impacts on individual rural households as a whole with a particular focus on youth headed households many rural households have shifted their primary employment from agriculture to nonagriculture especially in the more urbanized south in contrast change in livelihood diversification within rural households with family members primary employment in both agriculture and nonagriculture appears much less rapid rural youth headed households are significantly more associated with the transition away from agriculture than households headed by other adults and such trends are stronger in locations closer to larger cities particularly in the south although the nonagricultural economy is becoming increasingly important for rural households contrary to expectations the probit model analysis in this paper shows that agricultural production does not appear to be more intensified in terms of modern input use in the more urbanized south and youth do not show greater agricultural technology adoption than other adults indicating that the constraints against modern input adoption may be binding for all farmers including youth and farmers in more urbanized locations we also find that rural poverty rates are consistently lower among nonagricultural households and the share of middle class population is also disproportionately higher among rural nonagricultural households than agricultural households while the probit analysis confirms the positive relationship between being a nonagricultural household and being nonpoor or becoming middle class after controlling for all other factors education seems to play the biggest role as rural youth become more educated and more households shift from agriculture to the rural nonfarm economy a different range of technologies for agricultural intensification is necessary for agriculture to be attractive for youth a territorial approach and related policies that integrate secondary cities and small towns with the rural economy deserve more attention such that the diversification of rural livelihoods can become a viable alternative or complement to rural urban migration for youth
